### **Rules and Regulations:**

1. Competition restricted to members of District #7 4-H clubs or to clubs from other districts which have applied in writing to and been granted permission by the Society to have this serve as their Regional Show.
2. Animals with horns must not be shown, heifer project excluded.
3. Entries in this division are open to 4-H clubs, only.
4. The owner is responsible for the exhibits. All stock and equipment are at the owner's risk.
5. Weyburn Agricultural Society is not responsible for transportation or veterinary fees.
6. Entry forms must be submitted by leaders and corrections to the entries will be the responsibility of the 4-H club leader.
7. Each club supplies their own bedding and feed.
8. All animals must have suitable neck ropes and halters.
9. All electrical cords must have three prongs.
10. Show numbers must be worn by all exhibitors.
11. All animals must be on the grounds by 8:00 am, Monday July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024.
12. Animals will be weighed at 8:00 am, Monday, July 1<sup>st</sup>. Any exhibitor who is not present for weighing with their club will weigh after all clubs.
13. All weights will be final unless altered by the committee. Committee decision is final.
14. All calves must be put through the ring and sold by auction to the highest bidder. All club animals will be sold by the Society and proceeds, less 2% commission, 2% grounds fee and brand inspection fee.
15. On sale day, each club is responsible to designate 2 people to be on grounds to assist with the loading of animals until all club calves have left the grounds. Suitable halters must be left with steers after the sale. Each club is responsible for the paperwork for the removal of all animals.
16. Exhibits must not be dismantled until all the calves have been sold.
17. No trailers are allowed to be parked on the grounds during the fair.
18. No trucks or trailers are allowed around the barn area until all the calves have been sold.
19. Grooming of the 4-H animals is the responsibility of the registered 4-H members or members of the clubs attending the Weyburn Regional 4-H Show. WARNING: Any member having out of regional help with fitting will be disqualified from the Regional Show and Sale.
20. All stalls must be cleaned by 7:00 am each day.
21. No pictures with buyers should be taken until the sale is completely over.
22. All leaders are considered members of this committee.
23. No Keg party or any other party will be allowed on Ag. Society property, failure to follow this rule could lead to charges and disqualification from the sale.
24. Absolutely no chutes will be allowed in the barns.
25. \*\*\*All Steers MUST show in their appropriate weight class to be eligible to sell.\*\*\*
26. If members wish to donate all or part of calf proceeds, they must complete an agreement with the Weyburn Agricultural Society prior to the sale.
27. Any donated back steers will move to the end of the sale to be re-sold.
28. Best Home-Grown Steer will sell third in sale order if it isn't Grand or Reserve Grand Champion.
29. Cloverbuds are allowed to move up to the junior division for team grooming in their own club if the club is short a member in that division. If you don't have a full team, please submit your entries to the office. The committee will pick someone from the 4<sup>th</sup> place finishes of other clubs to complete your team.
30. No grafted calves allowed on a cow/calf continuation project.
